Culture

- La Boquería, San Antoni food markets.
- High street Portal del Angel.

- Shopping centres; Maremagnum, Las Arenas.
- La Roca outlet village.

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Eating

- Huge variety of international restaurants.
- Artisan bakeries, speciality coffee, craft beer, cocktail bars.
- Carrer del Blai famous for it's tapas.
- Traditional Catalan dishes; escalivada, calçots, pa amb tomàquet, crema catalana, vermut.

Climate

- Temperate Mediterranean climate.
- Hot and dry summers; 30°C.
- Mild winters; 10°C.
- 2,500+ hours of sunshine.
- Minimal rainfall.

Cost Of Living

- Lower than U.S. and Canada.
- Higher than the rest of Spain.
- Penny pinchers budget; US\$950.
- Average buget; US\$1,400.
- Big spenders; US\$1,750.

Transportation

- Excellent public transport; metro and bus.
- Very cyclable city; city bike scheme.
- Taxi's are relatively cheap; Freenow.
- Trains connect to other cities.
- Barcelona El Prat International Airport.

Housing

- Small apartments in city center.
- Websites for finding apartments; Idealista, Badi, Airbnb (short-term).
- Real-Estate agencies; expensive but secure.
- Recommend renting first in different areas.
