Plaza d'España

We begin our journey in Seville, or as the Spanish call it; Sevilla.

Located near the Portuguese border in the south-west corner of Spain, this dynamic city boasts many beautful attractions.

For example, The Plaza d'España is an open air tribute to the diverse, cultural regions of Spain. It features a man-made moat with gondola rides, an expansive, arched esplanade and impressively tiled facade.



Tiled Tribute

Pedestrians are encouraged to stroll along this unique tiled tribute, which basically spans the entire width of the Plaza.

Entrance to The Plaza d'Espanha is free.

It is customary to find Flamenco Dancers, Jugglers, Hand-Made Craft Vendors & Traditional Musicians at this venue. Of course, there is also a souvenir shop, washroom facilities and Ticket Counter on the grounds.



A Great Introduction to Spain's Diversity

Each region is represented with a tiled crest and map, informative signs and a historically or culturally significant scene, also depicted in tile.

Visitors are also free to visit some of the interior space and stroll along the shaded balcony, seen at the top of this photo.




Spanish Craftsmanship

Seville is a great location for those who crave delicious tapas, exhilerating Flamenco shows, an array of fascinating museums and flourishing architectural features.


Huge parks with beautifully sculpted gardens and giant shade trees are a welcome refuge from hot summer temperatures.


Surrounded by cafes and restaurants, it has become a favorite gathering place for locals and tourists alike.

Look out to a collage of ancient church spires and grimacing gargoyles competing with sun washed roof terraces and a sea of colorful storefronts.




Torre d'Ouro, Seville

Choose riverside views from pedestian walkways or one of many Cruise options but don't miss this Ancient riverside tower built to house royal treasure......






Hushed underground baths lie beneath the Real Alcazar Palace. This attraction is just meters away from the city's most famous Cathedral.



The 4D Cinema, Wetlands Aviary, Photographic Exhibitions and fun-filled Kid Zone add to one of Valencia's best attractions.




MUSEU DE LES CIENCIES AND HEMISFERIC DOME

But Spain offers an impressive, modern infrastructure. Cross-country and intercontinental transportation options, a great national health care system and impressive educational institutions top a long list of positives.



Valencia's churches are no exception. Their revered treasures, representing centuries of spiritual devotion should not be overlooked.



ONE OF THE MOST PHOTOGRAPHED EXTERIORS IN MADRID, CIBELES IS AN ENORMOUS ARCHITECTURAL SHOWSTOPPER.





Barcelona SAGRADA FAMILIA

THERE IS NOT A PHOTO FRAME BIG **ENOUGH TO CAPTURE THE** MAGNIFICENCE OF THIS MONOLITHIC **DESIGN BY GAUDI (1852 – 1926). INSPIRED BY HIS LOVE OF GOD AND** NATURE, GAUDI'S UNIQUE SIGNATURE STYLE MIXES ELEMENTS OF GOTHIC AND ART NOUVEAU. HIS WORK DOTS THE BARCELONA CITYSCAPE WITH **EASILY DISTINGUISHED** ARCHITECTURAL BRILLIANCE. SCHEDULED FOR COMPLETION IN THIS **DECADE, THE BASILICA DE LA SAGRADA FAMILIA IS A MUST SEE LANDMARK** THAT REPRESENTS THE ESSENCE OF SPANISH INNOVATION.



Barcelona SAGRADA FAMILIA

LIKE TREE TRUNKS REACHING FOR THE HEAVENS, GAUDI'S INTERIORS COMBINE THE IMPACT OF NATURAL LIGHT ON STAINED AND CRYSTALLIZED GLASS, CREATING A CELESTIAL AURA WHICH COULD BE COMPARED TO THE INTENSITY OF THE NORTHERN LIGHTS.

TICKETS TO THE BASILICA & MUSEUM SHOULD BE BOOKED IN ADVANCE, ONLINE. THE SAGRADA FAMILIA HAS ALREADY BEEN DECLARED A UNESCO WORLD HERITAGE SITE AND IS THE LARGEST UNFINISHED CATHOLIC CHURCH IN THE WORLD.



Barcelona CASA AMATLER & CASA BATLLO

FOUND IN THE EIXAMPLE DISTRICT, BOTH OF THESE GAUDI DESIGNED HOMES WERE COMMISSIONED BY PRIVATE CITIZENS AND USED AS RESIDENCES IN THE 1900'S.

TODAY, PRIVATE TOURS PROVIDE INSITE INTO THE FUTURISTIC MINDSET OF GAUDI...HIS PLAYFUL USE OF TILE, THE RICH HUES OF HIS WOODEN MOTIFS AND CUSTOM-DESIGNED FURNISHINGS, ELABORATE WINDOW DRESSINGS AND FRAMES. EVERY DETAIL; INCLUDING THOSE FOUND ON THE ROOF AND IN THE GARDEN, IS METICULOUSLY PLANNED.





Cadiz: An Ancient Seaside Mecca

You can sense the centuries of history in this city's quieter moments. Like the wisest of well-mannered ladies, she welcomes the present and future but never lets go of her past.


Whenever I visit Cadiz I feel like I'm on a 1950's movie set. A backdrop of lavish cobalt blue and lush green, sets the stage for a stellar cast of ancient ruins lying beneath massive shade trees, neighbored by crenelated rooftops, shadowed by steepled churches.



The Gentle Giants of Cadiz

Who needs an awning?

Whether you're walking along the coast, through a park, next to a garden or right through the center of town, you can't help but notice the enormous gentle giants of Cadiz.



Cadiz and La Caleta

Located alongside the historical city center, between the Castles of San Sebastien and Santa Catalina, La Caleta Beach (meaning 'the small bay' in Spanish) is a natural Atlantic harbor situated on Spain's Costa de la Luz.


Sunbathers, surfers and waterfront diners walk the sandy shore where ancient Carthaginians and Romans landed their ships.



Cadiz Roll a Pair of Rocky Dice

A chunky, man-made barrier helps to protect this pedestrian walkway from harsh Atlantic storms.

Although the water is often too cold for swimmers, surfers clad in bodysuits enjoy the small wave action regularly.

Finding Hidden Treasure in Cadiz

Cadiz has a fascinating history of shipwreaks, as depicted in this 3D art tableau on the coastline road.

Historians estimate that, dating from as far back as the Phoenicians, thousands of ships have sunk in The Bay of Cadiz and rest on the muddy ocean bed.

Archeologists believe that many of the wreaks were preserved by the mud but may soon be destroyed by current dredging operations and the expansion of the modern Port of Cadiz.
